BACKGROUND

Bendigo Livous Training Institute Pty Ltd applied for initial registration as a Registered Training Organisation. The application includes qualifications from the CHC, CPP and MEM training packages. Target clients include job seekers, existing workers as well as trainees employed under a training contract with intended modes of study including face to face at the RTO and workplace delivery.

The applicant has undertaken initial consultations with job network providers to identify the industry need for skilled workers in the community services, security and engineering sectors.

The organisation does not intend to engage other parties under partnership or subcontracting arrangements nor apply for government funding contracts.

The Certificate II in Security included in the application leads to the issuance of security guard license. In

Victoria the security industry is regulated by the Victorian Police. The applicant has undertaken initial industry consultation Victoria Police Licensing and Regulation Division with regard to the planned RTO, training strategies and resources

The management structure comprises of Mr Mohamed Mostafa as the Owner and Executive Officer and Mr John Zhang as the Compliance Manager.
